Latinos y el cáncer Educational Symposium

The 7th edition of *Latinos y el cancer* was held on Saturday, October 6, 2018 at MCC Stabile Research Building.

Latinos y el cáncer is an educational symposium designed to provide cancer education and resources to the Hispanic community in the Tampa Bay area.

Physicians and researchers from MCC and PHSU held interactive sessions to discuss cancer prevention, early detection, physical health and nutrition.

The event focused on cancer education on: cancer (skin, women's, colon, lung, prostate, leukemia, lymphoma); psychosocial care for patients and caregivers; nutrition; and genetics.

Over 140 participants attended the event. Half of the community members enrolled in our CONTINUAR protocol to track the longer-term impact of educational activities on cancer prevention knowledge and behaviors.




Salud! Serie de charlas

¡Salud! Serie de charlas is a quarterly educational series for the Hispanic/Latino community in the southern region of Puerto Rico organized by the Outreach Core

Two panelists discussed information on risk factors for prostate cancer (Jomar López, CHE), as well as the diagnosis and treatment of Human Papilloma Virus (HPV) (Dr. Lynnette Ruiz, PhD). This charla was conducted at *Iglesia Ministerio Vida con Propósito*, Cabo Rojo Municipality (rural área) and was attended by 68 community members, either patients of cancer or caretakers.

Event evaluations were highly positive. Importantly 29 community members had mammograms in addition to receiving blood pressure/glucose screenings and physical exams.

This investigation will help uncover risk and resilience factors, better preparing these and other communities for possible disasters down the road

The grant is funded by The National Institute on Minority Health and Health Disparities (NIMHD), part of the National Institutes of Health.

This project will lay a foundation for future research, leading to effective prevention measures and chronic disease management to improve quality of life following natural disasters.

Melissa Marzán, Dr.P.H., MPH is an Assistant Professor of the Public Health Program at the Ponce Health Sciences University (PHSU) since 2013. Dr. Marzan earned a Dr.P.H. degree from the PHSU and a Master's degree from the University of PR, both in Public Health with a major in Epidemiology. Dr. Marzan is currently a Postdoctoral Research Fellow in the Center for Sociomedical Research and Evaluation at the University of PR, Medical Sciences Campus.

As a new member of the Partnership, she is involved with two cores; the Planning and Evaluation Core (PEC) and the Outreach Core (OC). Under the PEC, she works closely with the PEC team from PHSU and Moffitt and the external evaluator, Dr. Quinn (NYU).

Dr. Marzán also works with the PHSU Outreach Core (OC) with Dr. Julio Jimenez. Her work focuses primarily, on statistical analysis of OC data necessary for preparation of publications, grants and progress reports.
